The 2023 National Cricket Inclusion Carnival has come to a close held in Brisbane from Sunday, February 5th – Friday, February 10th. The Carnival saw six states play each other across 5 round games with the hope to play off either in the 3 vs 4 Preliminary Final or the 1 vs 2 Grand Final. The Tasmanian Squad was made up of 14 members from across the state.

Nicholas Carter from northern Tasmania played for NSW as they could not field a side of players in their home state.

For the first time the ID Carnival was played in conjunction with the national blind and deaf inclusion championships with Tasmania having a combined team with the ACT in the blind division for the first time. It was fantastic to see the players of all abilities playing with such enthusiasm and spirit. All games of the carnival were played at Marchant Park, Aspley Queensland, which is a 10-oval park with turf pitches.

This carnival was the state's most successful carnival by far making the finals and grand final for the first ever time in the state's history. Liam 'Devo' Devlin and the boys won 4 out of 5 of their round games only losing to Victoria who they faced again in the Grand Final! Unfortunately, the boys were beaten by a better side on the day losing to Victoria by 8 wickets in the final. Each member of the squad played a key role in the overall success of the team. Standouts for the carnival were; Bailey Menzies & Craig Blaschke - both took the team's most wickets with 7 each, Bailey at an average of 4.86 and Craig at an average of 12.14. Connor Sheppard was the team's leading run scorer with 128 runs opening the batting at an average of 42.67. Joel Corbett also cracked 100 runs for the carnival making 103 runs at an average of 34.33. Special mention to Blake Bonnitcha who made 57 runs for the tournament only being dismissed once in 4 innings. At the Presentation Dinner held on Friday, February 10th at Kedron-Wavell Services Club, Chermside, Joel Corbett was awarded the most dismissals for the inclusion division with 3 catches and 3 runout assists.



Over the week we had many supporters including parents that made the trip up to support the team. A big thank you to Ian & Bronwen Colhoun for sharing driving duties and getting the boys safely to each game and back to the accommodation. It was great to see long time NCIC Tasmanian squad member Alan 'Dingo' Dengate who has recently moved to the sunshine state supporting the squad in the game against NSW. All the best to Dingo in his move and new job in Queensland. Thank you to the Colgrave family, to Brent & Claire for taking so many photos throughout the week. We cannot wait to see the week in pictures, thank you to **Tommy** for being the team's biggest supporter & 'team mascot' as many of the boys would call him! A huge thank you to Cricket Tasmania, coach Liam Devlin and assistant coach Josh Marshall for their huge part in the success of the team. The team is in good stead for years to come!
